

FIRST PLACE ARTIST'S STATEMENT:

"To me, watercolor is the perfect medium. I can exercise rigid control with a tightly rendered drybrush technique, or I can let the washes run, drip, and mix together any way they want to. I want to have fun with a painting, and I hope that people can see that in the finished product. Southern Gentleman is one of a series of paintings that I have done of a Georgia cotton farmer named John Reeves. He was a wonderful subject whom I was privileged to paint for several years until his recent death. A basketmaker, he would sit in one place for hours as he worked and I worked, and we talked. He was a poor man, but he was a rich man. I will never forget the Sunday afternoon that I gave him a portrait that I had done of him and his late wife, Lucille. He cried. I hope that I have been able to show you something in my painting of the strength, the sweetness, the power, and the humility of this Southern gentleman."

JUROR'S STATEMENT - CHENG-KHEE CHEE, AWSDF, NWS

I BELIEVE ARTISTS SHOULD CREATE WHAT THEY
MOST DEEPLY FEEL AT HEART AND WORK IN
WHATEVER CONTENTS, MEDIA, TECHNIQUES OR
STYLES THAT ARE MOST TRUE AND NATURAL TO
THEM TO EXPRESS THEIR UNIQUE VISIONS.
VIEWING THE SLIDES OF 565 ENTRIES, I WAS
DEEPLY IMPRESSED BY THE VITALITY, CREATIVITY,
QUALITY AND DIVERSITY OF THE WORKS SUBMITTED. THIS DIVERSITY REFLECTS THE SPIRIT OF
OUR TIME AND A TRUE FREE SOCIETY. AS WE
MARCH INTO THE NEW MILLENIUM, WE NEED TO



UNDERSTAND, RESPECT AND APPRECIATE DIFFERENCES. THE INTRODUCTION OF PLURALITY IN CREATIVE CONCEPTS AND PROCESSES IN ART WILL ONLY ENRICH ARTISTS AND LIBERATE THEM TO PURSUE THEIR UNIQUE VISIONS AND EXPLORE NEW FRONTIERS.

As a juror, therefore, I felt strongly that my selection should reflect this spirit of diversity. I tried to choose, in my opinion, the best paintings representing various concepts, ideas, contents, techniques, and styles. Under this broad guideline I looked to identify creativity, sensibility, individuality, humanity, spirituality, integrity, dexterity, and vitality. The works that spark communication and arouse strong aesthetic, intellectual, emotional, and spiritual responses are those which, in my opinion, have more of these qualities.

As usual, the most frustrating task in this process is to decline many outstanding paintings because of the space. I can only say that being a sole juror, I was able to spend ample time to give each entry a thoughtful, careful, analytical, and repeated viewing before making a decision. A different juror would have selected a different show. The paintings that were not selected for this show may very well receive high awards in other exhibitions. For those who were selected, I offer my sincere congratulations!

It was indeed a great honor and a most enriching, rewarding, and challenging experience for me to serve as a juror of this pretigious national exhibition. I would like to express my deep appreciation to the Louisiana Watercolor Society board members for their dedication that brought about this excellent national forum to showcase our medium. I also would like to commend the artists who submitted their works to support this endeavor.
