Putting together an exhibition of this scale is a huge project that requires the collaboration of many minds, hands, hearts and talents. ### FROM THE COMMUNITY

Watercolor, I believe, is one of the most versatile, yet still under-appreciated mediums. If we just look at the traditional version of it, when the powdered pigment is mixed with a water-soluble binder (gum arabic and other ingredients) without any white pigment added to it, or mixed with it later, we have one of the most unique paints to explore: It is transparent (even the larger molecule pigments) when added to water to create a "wash". Working from light to dark, leaving out the white of the paper instead of white paint, or combining the wash with that white color underneath, we can get the richest array of subtle or bright colors in tints and shades that glow! It may be applied more ways than I can mention here... on wet or dry surfaces, using brushes, sticks, stamping with various materials dipped into paint, sprayed, speckled, rolled with a brayer, glazed on top of other layers, soft-edged or hard, dry brushed, scraped, scrubbed off, over or under ink or pencil drawings, and more.

Now, let's add some white to our colors and we have opaque paint! We can buy it ready made (gouache) and suddenly, we can paint light on top of a dark color! Even more ways to use the paint! More texture, different techniques!

Acrylics mix with water, but once they're dry, cannot be diluted again. This quality allows still more possibilities: Brighter glazes, thicker layers of paint.

So, there are enough varieties of water-diluent pigments to use for any concept, method, style or subject matter anyone may desire. One can even mix these different paints, or collage painted pieces on top of each other.

As long as we work on paper, these all come under the heading of water media. Gone is the old-time use of watercolor for mostly preliminary sketches to be developed later in another medium.


With all of the new lightfast pigments and acid-free papers available today, in the hands of the many talented artists, watercolor can only become a more permanent and strong medium of its own right in the new millennium.

## JUROR'S STATEMENT - HENRY CASSELLI, NA, AWSDF

It has, indeed, been a great Honor and Joy to once again judge the Annual International Exhibition of the Louisiana Watercolor Society. An Honor because it is the fourth time I have judged the Exhibition, and a great Joy because, once again, I have been impressed by the high quality of entries that are helping to make this a truly Prestigious National Exhibition.

While it is a joint effort on behalf of the officers, chairpersons and tireless workers of LWS to promote, organize and present the Exhibition each year, it is, understandably, the ever improving quality of work of the hundreds and hundreds of entrants that send their best efforts to the Annual each year that has fostered the Prestige. I was reminded, often, as I judged the 578 slide entries, of that moment when each of us stands before that blank sheet of white watercolor paper. While I marvel at its beauty ... I stand there in utter fear ... Each and every time, to this day, it is as if it's my first time painting with watercolors ... and I have no idea where or how to begin!!! Extreme? No, and I don't think I would want it to be any other way. This is serious business we do ... this smearing around of paint on paper ... And I was pleased to see so much evidence of this seriousness as I was once again privileged to judge the entries.

My congratulations and sincere appreciation is extended to all of you who submitted works. Regardless of acceptance or rejection, I offer you this thought ... A very wise man once said to me, "Having your painting accepted in an exhibition does not make it a better painting ... nor does not having it accepted make it anything less." While his words are true, we all know the thrill of acceptance and the emptiness that comes with the rejection notice... What is more important to me, however, is that we are doing the work, experiencing the subject matter, absorbing the stimuli and painting the pictures... We are, in the truest sense, just being ourselves, for we are artists ... painters of pictures ... and what greater reward is there...?
