From the Community


John Hodge is a talented artist and teacher who lives and works in Covington, Louisiana. Although John works in many media, he is well known locally, as well as nationally, as a clay artist and potter. For the past twenty-two years, John and his wife, Francie Rich, have led many local and national artists on painting tours of Europe. His works can be seen in the New Orleans Museum of Art and the Southern Museum (Ogden Collection) in New Orleans. John is represented by Legato Gallery in Covington, Louisiana and the LeMieux Gallery in New Orleans, Louisiana.

"I recently had a conversation with a student whose daughter and son-in-law were moving out west. I asked her if the move was job related and she laughed and said, "it's what they do." She explained that they move every two to three years and that the moves range from Vermont to Idaho to Hawaii. I asked how they decide where to move and she laughed again and explained that they study the lists of the best places to live — best schools, best health care, best economy, etc. The conversation ended there but what struck me as ironic was they usually end up back in south Louisiana for several years before moving to the next "perfect place".

I think what we have in Louisiana can't be judged by those endless lists. I am not sure that I can even put my finger on it but one of the contributions to a climate that fosters creativity is an exhibition like this one. The efforts of many come together and afford artists from many states and countries to exhibit their work for the pleasure of those of us so lucky to be here to enjoy it."

Juror's Statement



It is indeed an honor and a privilege to judge the 32nd Annual International Exhibition of the Louisiana Watercolor Society. I was impressed by the overall high quality of the work submitted as well as the variety of approaches to the use of watermedia and the different forms of expressions. Thirty years ago, there was basically one way to do a watercolor; today there are countless directions. It is important to remember that the technique and approach to the media should serve the personal nature of the work that is the art.

Art, by its very nature, is a very personal thing. There is not an absolute right or wrong, or formula. That is what is so exciting about the act of painting. Every work takes its own path and has its own unique journey. We, as artists, all live for those special moments when the paint, brush,

paper, hand, mind, and eye, all merge and flow together and the image seems to come effortlessly and paint itself. Those special times happen when we are most deeply connected with our inner being. Thus, these certain paintings will most demonstrate our uniqueness.


When I jury a show, I look for many things. I look for the way the artist has handled the technical end of the painting; the color, composition, and the various elements of design. This is what I consider to be the craft of the painting. The craft is most important in order for the idea to most fully be expressed. But beyond that, and most important, I look for the artist's uniqueness of vision. This deals not with subject, but with an individual energy and mark that is put down with paint on paper. It is that connection with an elevated consciousness or a higher self. It can not be completely described but can be felt.

The work that I have selected for this year's exhibition is very diverse both in terms of subject matter and paint handling. It is a strong and beautiful exhibition. I congratulate each and every artist that has submitted to this show. There were over 750 entries and 82 accepted works. I wish all of you many new and exciting journeys and growth with your future work.
