President's Corner

Please do not fall in love with your workshop paintings!

- 1. LWS is very fortunate to be able to attract nationally known artists for our workshops. We have a great national reputation for treating our visiting artists with southern hospitality and charm. The best-of-the-best artists love to come visit us! But we have to make certain that what we learn from them does not translate into clones of their paintings!
- 2. The visiting artist-teachers have a great deal of techniques to show to us. They teach method, design, composition and application. Please take this knowledge home and use it in your own work. But do not fall in love with the work you accomplish in the workshop! You cannot enter it into any show at all.
- 3. Do not try to replicate a painting that you have painted in a workshop. Please do not be fooled into thinking that a painting done in a workshop can be re-painted at home or in your studio and be accepted into shows. Sometimes artist-teachers tell students that it is okay to re-paint a workshop painting but it clearly is not something that is recommended. Why? Because this is a painting designed to fool the screening committee. Let's face it, the members of the board, the screening committee, the show chair and the general membership take our workshops in great numbers. Everyone sits at open tables and usually sees everyone else's work. How will they be able to tell the difference between the painting you have done in the workshop and the one you cloned at home or in your studio? The workshop painting is ineligible for the show so why should a clone of an ineligible painting be accepted?
- 4. One thing you do not want to happen is for people to think you copied your work. It is very tempting to paint the exact same painting as the teacher. But try to look ahead and use the techniques that have been taught in the workshop to advance your own style to a more polished degree. You will be far happier when your work is recognized as your very own!

Odie Tucker was selected as the 26th Annual Madisonville Wooden Boat Festival's poster artist.


Watercolors by **Pat Dispenziere LWS** were juried into the San Diego Watercolor Society's International Exhibition, the Kansas Watercolor Society Exhibition, and the California Watercolor Association 46th National Exhibition.

Two watercolors by **Laurin McCracken LWS** were selected to be included in the Beijing Biennale 2015 and the National Museum of Art of China purchased one for their permanent collection. He is also a sponsor and exhibiting artist in the 2015 Shenzhen International Watercolor Biennale. After the close of the Biennale, the 233 artworks will travel for a year in a six-city national traveling exhibition. He also participated in the NWS International Small Image Exchange Exhibit 2015-2016, a joint exhibition of the NWS and SIWB in China. One of his paintings from the group show "Harvest" at Greenberg Gallery in Santa Fe was featured in a review of the show in American Art Collector's Oct. 2015 publication.
