We love seeing our members get involved and exhibit their work. We are also trying to put together some one-day, affordable workshops for LWS members who wish to enhance their watercolor skills.



As spring approaches, take a moment and look around at the beauty a warmer climate can bring. There are so many subjects and opportunities to bring inspiration. The beauty of water-color as a medium is the capability to paint whether there are 5 minutes of time or hours. I try to paint or draw something every day, even if there is only a minute or two to make a couple of brushstrokes, swatch a new color, try a new technique, or achieve that texture that has me stumped. I encourage you all to find time to treat yourself and escape into your creative side. It is a healthy way to relieve the stress of the day. Creativity creates a healthy state of mind. In a 2014 study, the participants who made art saw a "significant improvement in psychological resilience". They also saw increased levels of "functional connectivity". This is the part of the brain that helps with introspection, self-monitoring, and MEMORY. It can also delay aging!

"I am drawn to subjects that beg to be painted because of drama created by light, color, contrast, or that tell a story". Anything is "fair game". I am not concerned with having a particular style, but I am drawn to realism because of the challenge presented in producing a work with depth on a flat surface. I may use multiple techniques within one painting as the subject dictates. I believe that if I am passionate about my subject, it will be evident in my work." Claudia is a Past President and the current Treasurer of LWS. She was born in Ohio and she attended Mississippi College for Women ("The W") as an Art Major and the Dayton Art Institute in Ohio. Later, she moved to Louisiana with her sister and spent 57 years working in the accounting and finance field in the Baton Rouge area until retirement in 2017 when she began following her lifelong love of art where she has won many awards from exhibiting in Mississippi, Arkansas, and Louisiana.

LWS Member Spotlight by: Peggy Kirby



Col. Jonathan "Neal" Vizina – LWS thanks you for your service! Jonathan "Neal" Vizina, LWS's new Southwest Louisiana Liaison, hails from Mamou, Louisiana. After completing a degree in Art Education from the University of Southwestern Louisiana (now the University of Louisiana Lafayette), Neal served as a Marine Corps pilot for 25 years. Colonel Vizina flew both planes and helicopters on missions in Europe, Asia, and Africa. He served in Iraq before being assigned to tours at the Pentagon, Capitol Hill, and the White House. He was Presidential Command Pilot for Ronald Reagan's Marine One in 1987-88. Marine Corps Christmas cards that he drew for the White House during that time are now in the National Archives in Washington, DC. While in the Marines, Neal earned a degree in Electrical Engineering from George Mason University. Upon retiring from the military, he returned to Louisiana where he pursued a career in engineering. Neal worked in the oil and gas industry for another 21 years. After retiring a second time, Neal finally could devote his attention to his first passion - art.

Not surprisingly, Neal's early art featured amphibious and aircraft carrier operations, as well as DC architecture. His first portrait was of his beloved father who passed away in 1988. Neal first worked primarily in pen, pencil, and ink. Neal credits his wife, Margretta, for urging him to branch out to watercolor. His watercolor works depict his love of Louisiana (especially Acadiana). He paints local seafood, birds, insects, flowers, storefronts, and Mardi Gras. Neal's Great Egret earned a 3rd place ribbon at the 2022 LWS Oak Knoll Show. He is honored to have his recent work, Thank You for Your Service-A Gold Star Family, selected for exhibit at the American Gold Star Mothers Foundation in Washington, DC. Ret. Col. Vizina's still life (above) pays tribute to fallen military personnel who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Stay on I-10 East and veer right headed into New Orleans to the Metairie Road Exit.

Exit, staying to the left, turn left onto City Park Ave. at the first red light.

Stay on City Park Ave. past the red light at Orleans Ave.

Take a left into the Park under the iron entrance archway and cross the railroad tracks.

Take a right at the Stop sign. See the Peristyle (big open building with columns) on your right.

Plenty of free parking lots between the Peristyle and Botanical Gardens to the far left

The New Orleans Botanical Gardens, TEN ACRES OF ENCHANTMENT open year round contains more than 2,000 varieties of plants from around the world. The seeds for the Garden were planted in 1936, when the City Park Rose Garden opened. The Botanical Garden was funded by the Works Progress Administration (WPA), which created New Orleans' first public classical garden. Today, it is one of the few remaining examples of public garden design from the WPA and displays the Art Deco influences of three renowned talents of the era: architect Richard Koch, landscape architect William Wiedorn, and sculptor Enrique Alférez.
