Thank you so much for entering your painting into the Louisiana Watercolor Society's 53rd Annual International Exhibition. I am honored to choose this show and the award recipients. This is a full circle moment for me. LWS was instrumental in starting my watercolor journey. I met members from the society during the first watercolor workshop I ever participated in. Those members encouraged me to join LWS and talked me into entering a painting into their member's show. They showed me the ropes and gave me the encouragement and validation I needed to start a professional career.

I applaud you for entering this show, no matter what stage of your artistic journey. It takes courage and bravery to share your work and have it be judged. I know exactly how it feels to be included in shows and win awards and I also know exactly how brutal it is to be rejected from shows and not win awards. This journey is a roller coaster full of highs and lows.

Choosing and judging a show is a monumental task. I really contemplated each painting, seeking a well balanced show. I have a set of guidelines that I had in mind when choosing this show. First and—foremost, I looked for strong compositions. Compositions are the foundation of any piece, no matter what the subject matter. Like the foundation of a house, if the composition isn't strong the rest will crumble. Secondly, I looked for technical merit. Does the artist have a strong knowledge of the watercolor medium? I teach a lot and have looked at a lot of student works in these classes, and I can see when someone has a real grasp of the medium and when they are still in progress. This simply takes time and practice so if your piece wasn't chosen, keep painting. The last thing I looked for was originality. Did the artist present their idea in a creative way. It is a given that there will be—categories that paintings will be grouped into, still life, portraiture, landscapes, abstract, etc. I was looking for a well-balanced show that had a nice representation in these categories. Only so many still life paintings will make it into the show, only so many portraits, only so many landscapes, abstracts, etc., so how did the artist set theirs apart from the others? Was the composition—interesting, was the subject matter presented in an interesting way? Is there a strong graphic appeal? Having a creative take on a subject can set your painting apart from the others. There is also subjectivity that goes into this process whether we like it or not. Some pieces will resonate for one reason or another. So even if your piece wasn't chosen for this show or doesn't win an award, enter it in another show because it very well could be successful in future exhibitions.

To those artists who received awards, congratulations! It was an honor to view your works and you should be proud of this moment. No matter what your status was in this show, I encourage every one of you to put brush to paper every day and challenge you to think of each painting as your next best masterpiece. Set goals and have even grander goals for when you surpass those. This is your artistic journey and your roller coaster ride, make it a great one!

She later assisted there with children's lessons and by the time of her high school graduation, she was selling her original works. Chryl continued her art during and after her college years, refining her skills and completing many pieces of original work, both commissions and commercial art.

Now living in Mandeville, LA she worked as an assistant art instructor at the Mandeville and Baton Rouge Fine Arts Academy. Many of her paintings are composed and painted while boating along the scenic Tchefuncte River, Lake Ponchartrain, the Rigolets, along the Mississippi Gulf Coast and her travels in the US and abroad. She uses a variety of techniques, including pencil, pastels, watercolor, acrylics, oils, and egg tempera. Her work has been accepted and exhibited in shows sponsored by the LWS, the National Acrylic Painter's Assoc., the New Orleans Art Assoc. and the St. Tammany Art Assoc., as well as the Mississippi Watercolor Society and the Art Guild of LA River Road Show. She was selected as the 2005 Madisonville Wooden Boat Festival poster artist. She is a signature member of the Louisiana Watercolor Society and currently teaches beginner and advanced classes at Abbey Art Works in Covington, Louisiana.

Please consider purchasing your lunch from the Oak Knoll Club. They have graciously provided the painting space which allowed us to reasonably price the workshop. They are very accommodating for those who have dietary restrictions.

<u>About the class</u>: Artists of all levels are welcome. Students will trace the pattern onto rice paper using a waterproof black Sharpie. The subject will then be painted using tonal values, lightest to darkest, preserving all whites. <u>First waxing</u> is applied to preserve subject and provide movement in background. Background is painted using mid to dark values. <u>Final waxing</u> and Batik wash applied.

ART Sale and Wine Tasting Event

Just a tidbit of news about a fun and exciting upcoming **ART SALE and WINE TASTING EVENT** between **LWS** and **Jacmel Inn**, a popular upscale restaurant located on East Morrison Street in Hammond, Louisiana.

We are in early discussions with the owner about having an Art Sale in their outdoor courtyard during the evening of Friday October 13th. The owner plans to contact several select California Wine Vendors and invite them to participate in a Wine Tasting Event in conjunction with an LWS Art Sale.

Local LWS Artists met with Jacmel in April and have tentatively agreed to provide their artwork which will be for sale during the event. Jacmel will provide their outdoor courtyard for the Artists and the Wine Vendors as a venue to set-up and display the artworks and the wine booths. Jacmel will sell entry tickets for the event to cover the cost of setups, finger foods and the servers who will work the event. LWS will make a percentage from of any of the artwork sold during the event.

We're still working out the details which will be discussed at the next LWS board meeting. We hope to follow up with more information sometime in mid-August or early September. Stay tuned for ticket prices, event start and end times and other details.
